## The Battle Of Mind — Pastor Hamyan Pham

There's a fierce battle around us 24x7. This battle affects every individual, family, neighbourhood, community, society, and nation. This battle is everywhere we go. It is called the battle of the mind. Craig Groeschel says, *"Our mind is the battlefield. And most of life's battles are won or lost in your mind."*

Our thoughts are powerful. They change our perspective, impact our decisions, and influence our habits. Our behaviours are always affected by what we think. We subconsciously make choices to speak and act in ways that are consistent with the prevailing thoughts in our minds. Our mind is like a garden: Whatever we plant, it will sprout, germinate and grow to become even the strongest tree. So, it is very important for us to enjoy life to the fullest, and we must learn to identify and reject unhealthy thought patterns.

*'Be careful how you think, your life is shaped by your thoughts'*  
Proverbs 4:23

Our lives are always moving in the direction of our strongest thoughts. **We are the by-product of our thoughts.** Proverbs 23:7 *"As he thinks in his heart, so is he."* Whatever we allow to captivate our thought life will eventually control our lives. The life we are experiencing today is largely a result of our thought life yesterday.

Every attack starts in our minds. Since we are always at war, and if our minds are not fixed on the truth of God, and if we don't guard our thoughts, it will lead to wrong actions. So, one of the most important things we need to learn ourselves and teach others is how to guard, strengthen, and renew our minds, because the battle for sin always starts in the mind.

Satan desires to control our thought life. Many of us, however, are so interested in fighting an external war with the Devil, that we forget that the most important battle is not with external forces, but within our own mind, heart and thoughts. Our mind is often very rebellious. Paul talks about this in Romans 7, *"I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing... Wretched man that I am!"* (Romans 7:19, 24).

*"Though we walk in the flesh, we are not waging war according to the flesh. For the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh but have divine power to destroy strongholds. We destroy arguments and every lofty opinion raised against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive to obey Christ."*  
2 Corinthians 10:3-5

The above verses contain the keys to victory in an area where most Christians are constantly defeated. The apostle Paul says that we have to "destroy strongholds." Stronghold is a fortified place. Rick Warren in his article entitled: "The Battle of your mind" says that "Stronghold is a mental block." Paul is talking about opinions and arguments set up against the knowledge of God. This is a mental battle. And Paul says, "Destroy these strongholds." A stronghold could mean a worldview, philosophies and theories that people set up against the knowledge of God. A stronghold can also be a personal attitude. Worry, doubt, fear, guilt, resentment, insecurity can be a stronghold. What we feed our minds with becomes a mindset. Anything that we make an idol in our lives can be a stronghold — All of these things can be strongholds in our minds. And the Bible says that we are to tear them down. Identify and reject ideas that are contrary to God's Word.

A mindset is impossible to change without changing what our mind is filled with. There is a default setting in a computer. When we want to type something, there is a default font style and font number. Unless we change the default setting, it will always remain. This is how most people live their lives. Because their default hasn't changed, their situation hasn't changed. It always brings back to the same old life. The problem is with our default. Until we change our default, we will always go back to being who we were before, because we have never changed our minds.

We must train our mind to win the battle of mind. (2 Corinthians 10:5) Train our thoughts on thinking God's truth. Paul says, *"take every thought captive to obey Christ."* It means "to control, to conquer, to bring into submission." We make it submit. Every thought obedient to Christ.

*Romans 12:1-2 tells us not to follow or conform to the world's system that are contrary to God and the Biblical teachings. But to transform like the butterfly from caterpillar (metamorphosis) by renewing of our minds.*

The word "repentance," in Greek word 'metanoia' which means to change your mind. Metanoia means a change of mind by turning/changing direction. That's what repentance is, a new normal, a new default setting. It's like saying, I'm gonna stop falling back into the same old pattern, same old default setting. I'm getting ready to change my default settings.

*Philippians 4:8*

*And now, dear brothers and sisters, one final thing. Fix your thoughts on what is true, and honourable, and right, and pure, and lovely, and admirable.*

*Psalms 119:15,*

*"I meditate on your precepts and consider your ways." David is saying, Lord, I'm training my mind on your truth. To see your truth.*

When our mind is changed, our lives will be transformed. Where our mind goes, our life follows. If we don't control what we think, we can never control what we do. Let's take back our mind and meditate on the truth of God.

# MENTAL HEALTH

*M*oving away from home is one of the most significant milestones in our transition to adulthood. As fun and thrilling as it may seem to be away from home, it comes with responsibility and accountability, which affects our physical and mental health in many ways.

Mental health includes our emotional, psychological and social well-being. It affects how we think, feel and act. Although the mind and body are often viewed as being separate, good mental health has a positive impact on our physical health and vice versa.

Mental health is the buzz of the town these days; Staying away from family and having to be independent in a big city can be hard, and excelling or keeping up with studies and work can be strenuous. We all have our share of inevitable problems, many a time it is difficult to share it with our peers or even our family: we are often lost, stressed and anxious. We tend to feel worthless like there's no way out and eventually lose hope. During these times, it feels impossible to feel happy or even go back to our normal self and schedule.

If you look into Esther in the Bible, she was a young Jewish woman who stayed far from home; Even then she helped people there and eventually prospered because God was with her—guiding, protecting and directing her. Similarly, Joseph was one of Jacob's 12 sons, he was sold as a slave in Egypt by his own brothers, but because God was with him and he believed in God, he became a governor in the same land he was sold to.

Staying in a place so far from home is challenging, sometimes in the worst possible way. Juggling academic works with other responsibilities can be tough. But having friends to help you through, having a church we can go to on Sundays and having a God who listens to us always is comforting and reminds us that "we are not alone".

# Christianity or Pseudo-Christianity

What is Christianity? The Christianity we see today is far different from the Christianity we see in the Bible. Something else has evolved in the name of Christianity today. So much of falsehood and dilution is visible – a pseudo-Christianity. How genuine is your Christian life? If this issue was there in the first century (see 2 Corinthians 11:4), how much more it prevails today. In the name of gospel, something else is being preached.

The kind of life considered today as Christian life may not be accepted by the Lord in the end. The end will tell what it is. One can be just presuming and living the way one wants. Proverbs 14:12 says *“There is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death”*. So, just because majority are walking in certain acceptable patterns and norms do not justify the end because God’s system is not democracy.



What if the way we are walking today is not the right path and at the end we discover that the life we have lived all those years was a false life. What will we do? Didn’t apostle Paul had the same concerns and fear when he said that, when he had preached to others, he himself should not be a castaway or a counterfeit. Imagine, we have been storing bundles of high currency note for years together but later realized that those notes are just a counterfeit. Will it not be a tragic end? Does this issue not bother us in our lives? To know the genuineness of our Christianity, we must know in the first place that we are Christian as prescribed in the Bible, not in terms of our own definition. Only when we realise that we are Christian of the Bible, only then we will strive to live a genuine Christian life.

Therefore, how careful and honest we must be to see our own foundation. This brings us back to the fundamental question - Who is a Christian? Acts 11:26 tells us that the disciples were called Christians not because he is born into a Christian home/family, neither they are called Christians because they bear the name, nor it is because they are somebody who writes in the religion column. **Becoming a disciple calls for radical decisions and radical changes in the way of life** (see Matthew 10:37-39; Matthew 16:24-26). **We must go through the narrow gate. If at all you find a broad way, please know that it will not lead you to life. A kind of convenient and comfortable living today will not take you to the path of life. Only few will find the way of life. We cannot live in presumptions. We cannot afford to lose eternity trying to live the best life of the broad way.** In Mark 10:17 we see that just because Jesus loved the rich young man, Jesus did not make the gate wider for him. To be a disciple is a difficult thing for man. Then, how is this made possible? With God all things are possible.

**So, the question is - are you a disciple of Jesus Christ? In other words, are you a Christian of the Bible or Christian of your own definition?**

No one can become a Christian by natural birth or by education or by merely going to church gathering or observing certain Christian norms. One cannot educate someone to be a Christian. **Being Christian calls for a totally new humanity, a new constitution out of the earth life. It is not by natural birth but by re-birth. Born not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God** (see 1 Peter 1:23; John 1:12-13). God is involved in our new birth by his word, his Spirit and his will. God is coming into the scene and you are born again. Heaven is involved. It is made possible in God by this great miracle of a new birth, the miracle of all miracles, the miracle of God making one to be born-again. It is this miracle of a new birth that enables us to be a Christian, to be a disciple (see John 3). No other ways or forms will make you become a Christian, no matter how popular and acceptable those practices and forms may be with men.

**To be born-again is to repent and have faith towards God.  
Are you a disciple/christian? How genuine is your Christianity?**

A few weeks after the camp I felt very low or I would say, I was depressed, I didn't know the reason, my heart was not feeling right, I was feeling lonely and sad. Indeed, there was no one. Then I accepted Jesus Christ as someone I trust and whom I lean on and entitled Him as my personal Saviour that changed my life. I started praying, day by day. I got better, prayer healed my heart. After that phase, there was something that changed in me.
